

## A presentation of Jesus Christ as no friend of the Bible



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The Little Scroll is the disentanglement of the testimony of Christ from the testimony of sinners living from the Old Testament.

This is the Little Scroll of Revelation 10.

1.

The Tree of Life became flesh and dwelt among us. He was sent by the Father and revealed Himself as the Way, the Truth and the Life to all mankind past, present, future. His fruit is His Words.

All who ate His Words, and believed that He was sent by the Father, were given His life in order that they could share His Words to give life to all who feast on them, who believe them to be the truth.

But men lived by unsound knowledge, hating this Fruit-bearing Tree and tried to cut Him down but failed.

Three hundred years after Jesus had revealed who He was, men planted trees of knowledge around the Tree Of Life to create an orchard. They called this orchard the Bible and claimed that all the trees were the same, and all of the fruit they offered, good to eat.

They justified the Bible as suitable spiritual food with this scripture in a letter written by Paul to Timothy:

"All scripture is given by inspiration of God, and is profitable for doctrine, for reproof, for correction for instruction in righteousness. " 2 Timothy 3:16

But where there is justification, there is sin.

This allowed them to acknowledge life, yet live by knowledge

that is tainted, corrupt.

Paul wrote this letter to Timothy in Greek and the word he used for "inspiration" was "theo-pneustos" which means Godbreathed.

Paul did not refer to the Bible as God-breathed for it didn't exist when he wrote the letter. Only the scrolls existed, rolls of parchment comprising the Torah - the 5 books of Moses plus others. Ironically, some of the texts finally chosen for the compilation of the Bible around the 3<sup>rd</sup> century AD were written by followers like Paul, all of whom would not have referred to their writings as 'scripture' in the context that Paul used the word. Would Paul have referred to his letters as 'scripture'? Paul's letters were neatly slotted in to give the Jewish canon it's credibility as the Word of God.

Paul experienced a conversion to Christ after persecuting Christians. Brought up as a Pharisee he still held on to his strong Pharisaic traditions. He believed that the twenty four books of the Jewish Canon, which were kept as separate scrolls in the Temple constituting a large part of the Old Testament, were God-breathed. Even the Apostles didn't trust him when he went to see them in Jerusalem.

Therefore, when Paul wrote this letter to Timothy, the only "scripture" that existed were these scrolls and it was these that Paul referred to as "all scripture".

Paul's statement about these scrolls in his letter to Timothy directly contradicted Jesus who had only a few years earlier made it clear to the Pharisees, who were the teachers and descendants of the Old Testament characters who wrote these scrolls, that they were NOT God-breathed when He said to them:

"You search the Scriptures (scrolls) diligently because you think that in them you have eternal life. These are the very Scriptures that testify about me, yet you refuse to come to me to have life." John 5:39

Jesus is clearly saying that there is no life in men's words but points to these words because some of them refer to Him who is Life, the One who brings eternal life down to Earth.

Paul's decision to uphold the words of the blind as Godbreathed is contrary to Jesus' testimony about Himself being the Light of the World, which not only makes the first ever recorded conversion of a Pharisee to be construed as a questionable event, in view of his opposition to Jesus' revelation about Himself, but set in stone the Jewish demand at various Councils for some of their demonic texts to be included in the canon. With Paul's help we have a Bible, a toxic mix of old and new wine, a Pharisaic/Christian mismatch of testimonies about God, and a fundamentally flawed image of God that millions of Christians have lived their lives by in error for centuries ever since.

An example of this fundamental flaw is as follows:

Pharisee: "God hates sinners" Palm 5 v 5

Christian "God loves sinners" John 3 v 16

Moreover, those that teach every word in the Bible as Godbreathed or as inspired by God, do so with the knowledge that Islamic scholars argue their religion has its roots in the Old Testament who cite Abraham as the founding father of their religion.

According to the Bible, Abraham and his sons are said to be the founding fathers of the Arabic people. But wait, there's more. The Koran (2:135) says that Islam is not a new religion, but rather to be seen as a continuance of Abraham's original religion thus:

"Be Jews or Christians [so] you will be guided." Say, "Rather, [we follow] the religion of Abraham, inclining toward truth, and he was not of the polytheists."

Thus Christians preach and teach not only from the words that Jesus spoke but also from the words of believers, the words of Satan, the words of demons, the words of witches and the words of unbelievers because of their theological training in seminaries and universities where the Bible is perceived as a holy book, as an authentic description of God.

They also uphold genocide and other atrocities recorded in the Bible as events inspired by the will of God and also find themselves bound to do so.

In **Numbers 31: 7-18** The Israelites kill all the Midianites except for the virgins, whom they take as spoils of war.

Here's the passage:

They attacked Midians as the Lord had commanded Moses, and they killed all the men. All five of the Midianite kings—Evi, Rekem, Zur, Hur, and Reba—died in the battle. They also killed Balaam son of Beor with the sword. Then the Israelite army captured the Midianite women and children and seized their cattle and flocks and all their wealth as plunder. They burned all the towns and villages where the Midianites had lived. After they had gathered the plunder and captives, both people and animals, they brought them all to Moses and Eleazar the priest, and to the whole community of Israel, which was camped on the plains of Moab beside the Jordan River, across from Jericho. Moses, Eleazar the priest, and all the leaders of the community went to meet them outside the camp. But Moses was furious with all the generals and captains who had returned from the battle.

"Why have you let all the women live?" he demanded. "These are the very ones who followed Balaam's advice and caused the people of Israel to rebel against the Lord at Mount Peor. They are the ones who caused the plague to strike the Lord's people. So kill all the boys and all the women who have had intercourse with a man. Only the young girls who are virgins may live; you may keep them for yourselves.

In **1 Samuel 15:1-9** God tells the Israelites to kill all the Amalekites – men, women, children, infants, and their cattle.

In **Judges 21:1-23** A tribe of Israelites didn't come to the assembly, so the other Israelites killed them all except for the virgins who were raped.

In **2 Kings 2:23-24** Forty two children tease the prophet Elisha and God sends bears to dismember them.

In **Judges 19:22-29** A mob demands to rape a godly master's guest. The master offers his daughter and a concubine to them instead. They take the concubine and gang-rape her all night. The master finds her on his doorstep in the morning, cuts her

into 12 pieces, and ships the pieces around the country.

In **Judges 11:30-39** Jephthah burns his daughter alive as a sacrificial offering for God's favour in killing the Ammonites.

In **Deuteronomy 17:12** God makes a law which allows priests to kill anyone that won't listen to them.

Would Jesus Christ commit murder, rape children and personally smite those who don't listen to him?

Again as previously quoted, in **Psalm 5:5** We are told that God hates sinners.

This is a direct contradiction of Jesus who says:

"For God so loved the world, that he gave his only begotten Son, that whosoever believeth in him should not perish, but have everlasting life." John 3:16 (KJV)

The Pharisees upheld their scriptures as divine which inspired them to consider the death of Jesus as the will of God.

"They will put you out of the synagogue; in fact, a time is coming when anyone who kills you will think he is offering a service to God. They will do such things because they have not known the Father or me." Jesus said. Jn:16 2-3

In similar fashion millions of Christians today uphold this false teaching about the Bible, contradicting Jesus who told the Pharisees that they didn't know God:

Then they asked him, "Where is your father?" Jesus replied: "If you knew me, you would know my Father also." John 8:19

Jesus revealed to Nicodemus, also a Pharisee that no one had

ever entered heaven except Himself:

"No one has ever gone into heaven except the one who came from heaven—the Son of Man" John 3:12

Jesus also told Nicodemus:

"Jesus replied, "Very truly I tell you, no one can see the kingdom of God unless they are born again" John 3:3

So it is clear from Jesus' own words that the Pharisees who were the teachers of the Old Testament scrolls and their ancestors who wrote them, didn't know God, were unsaved or not born again, and had never entered Heaven.

Taking Jesus' God-breathed words and retrofitting them to the Old Testament scrolls, a work created by the unsaved, then calling it all the Word of God is no different from taking Jesus' God-breathed words and stitching them onto any other religious work written by anybody, anywhere, who didn't know God and calling it all the Word of God.

Yet many churches are built on this foundation.

Jesus also confirmed that the new and the old cannot go together.

"No one sews a patch of unshrunk cloth on an old garment, for the patch will pull away from the garment, making the tear worse. 17 Neither do people pour new wine into old wineskins. If they do, the skins will burst; the wine will run out and the wineskins will be ruined. No, they pour new wine into new wineskins, and both are preserved." Matthew 9:16-17

Yet only three hundred years later the new was patched into the old by men with unsound and contrary understanding of the

man who came down from heaven.

It would be pertinent to remind yourself that at the time of Jesus' first advent the known world was the Roman Empire and Judaism was tolerated across the Empire thanks to the efforts of proselytising Jewish traders like Paul which over time ushered in a one world religion of Judaism that later got bolstered by the narrative of Christ that was appended to it as the 'new' religion.

Jesus was born a Jew and so many people consider His testimony as an endorsement of Judaism but on the contrary Jesus was born a Jew so He could easily witness to His own people first in order to reform their ideas about God and then bring them and the rest of the world to enjoy the fruit of having eternal life through belief in Him as the only true Word of Life instead of death through belief in words not inspired by God.

Stubbornly they clung to the authority of their own dark narrative about a tangible God who arranged deadly physical punishments, precipitating in due course their rejection of Christ and a call for his physical punishment of death.

Paul upheld the teachings of the old one world religion and infected Christianity with its poison.

The Little Scroll is sweet as honey for those who want to uphold the God-breathed words of Jesus as the Word of God but a bitter pill to swallow for those who idolise the Bible, who want to try and justify the whole Bible as the Word of God contrary to the clear explanations given by Jesus.

Revelation 10: 9-11

The Little Scroll releases true followers of Jesus from the

bondage of the Old Testament. Of being bound to a testimony containing dark, unsavoury and false ideas about God, clearing the path for true teachers of The Way and the return of Christ.

The Little Scroll delivers this eternal truth.

Only Jesus' Words are God-breathed because only Jesus was conceived by the Spirit of God, making Him the Son of God, who spoke words that will never die.

He is the Word from God and only His Words are the Word of God.
